# 2020 Brule County 4-H Rodeo COVID Safety Mitigation Plans.

In an effort to continue Brule County's long tradition of promoting youth development through the ideals instilled in rodeo, the Missouri Valley Horseman's Club propose the following COVID Safety Mitigation Plan for our 2020 4-H Rodeo. We plan to implement the following changes for the 2020 event.

### Contestants

- Please enter/attend the rodeo at your own risk. We also ask that if you are feeling sick, have a fever, or any other symptoms, we ask that you stay home and not attend.
- We will also ask that only immediate family members and contestants attend the rodeo.
- There will be no check in at the rodeo. If contestants come to the rodeo office, we will ask if they have a temperature or any symptoms. If they are symptomatic, we will ask that they do not compete, and will have their entry fees refunded.
- Face Masks are required in the arena zone. Face masks may be pulled down while competing.
- Overnight Camping spots are not available on the rodeo grounds.
- We will provide hand sanitizer at the office, concession stand and all arena gates for public use.
- At points of congregation, such as behind the roping chutes or behind the bucking chutes, groups of over 10 will be asked to separate. Practice Social Distancing, as you fell necessary, at all times.

#### Rodeo Staff/Volunteers

- In effort to limit the financial burden facing our community, we are not actively seeking sponsorships for our rodeo. We will not be inviting sponsors to the rodeo this year, nor advertising our rodeo, in order to limit spectator attendance.
- We will clean/ sanitize our bathrooms before the event, and will have one person responsible for cleaning and sanitizing at least twice throughout the event, and again when the event is completed.
- We will provide masks for all of our workers to wear throughout the event.
- This year, we will have 1 person setting barrels, poles, etc., in order to limit cross contamination. Will recommend that this person also wear gloves. We will try to limit the number of volunteers to the bare minimum, both to limit exposure amongst the volunteers and to limit the total attendance of the event.
- We will make additional flags for the Flag Race, and spray them with disinfectant between each contestant.
- We will make additional flags for the judges and timers, so each person has their own "dedicated" flag.
- We will mark off 6' social distancing marks at the concession stand and rodeo office.
- Picnic Tables will be removed.
- Our COVID safeguards will be printed and included with our entry form, printed copies will be posted at the event, and rodeo announcers will remind people of them throughout the event.

We have contacted our local city leaders, and they are in full support of having our annual rodeo. They want to return to a sense of normalcy as soon as safely possible.

We believe that by following this procedures, we can host a meaningful, competitive event for the youth in our area, while doing it in a safe and responsible manner. We look forward to seeing you at our rodeo.
